**Everett Community College – Monroe**

Everett Community College (EvCC) operates a satellite campus in Monroe. Classes are held at Monroe High School and Park Place Middle School in the evenings. EvCC rotates required courses so that the Associate of Arts degree may be obtained in Monroe within two years.

**College Level Credits**

Running Start students may take any 100 or higher level courses. Juniors and seniors may obtain credits at no cost while satisfying high school requirements through the Running Start program. Students are admitted into the program through a competitive application process. Students need to contact their high school counselors for program application.

Through the Tech Prep program, EvCC credits may be earned for courses taken at the high school in technical programs. Tech Prep college credits may be granted in the areas of Marketing, Family and Consumer Science, Applied Technology, Business Technology and almost all Sno-Isle programs. Ask teachers for information or contact Sheila Dunn at (360) 804-4523.

Through College-in-the-High School, EvCC credits may be earned for courses taken in college preparatory programs. Individual instructors in the areas of Chemistry, English, French and History may have agreements with the College for this program.

**Other Credits**

EvCC provides a high school completion program for students who are lacking sufficient credits to graduate and who cannot realistically make up these credits within the high school setting. EvCC can make referrals to its main campus for the Youth Re-engagement Program. This program assists out-of-school youth with job training and completion of high school. Students needing more information on these options should contact their counselors as soon as possible.

EvCC provides adult education classes at Park Place Middle School. During each quarter on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6:00-8:50 p.m., EvCC instructors provide basic skills training in mathematics, reading, English composition, and preparation for the General Equivalency Degree (GED). On Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00-9:00 p.m., EvCC instructors teach English as a Second Language (ESL) including non-speaking through intermediate levels.

**Community Technology Center**

EvCC and Monroe Public Schools provide a Community Technology Center for youth and adults needing computer training, ESL, and basic skills assistance. EvCC instructors work one-on-one with people of all ages using software including Microsoft Office, ESL, remedial English and math programs. The center is free to the general public and is open Monday through Thursday, 2:30-5:00 p.m. and Saturday noon to 3:00 p.m. at Park Place Middle School, Rooms A4 and A5.
