

Monroe schools' STEM Learning EXPO set for April 6 at Monroe High

MONROE, WA – STEM prompts many to think of the part of a flower that holds up the blossom rather than the fairly new term describing the critical role **S**cience, **T**echnology, **E**ngineering and **M**ath play in how well youth are prepared for future education and success in their chosen career.

Learn what it is all about and how Monroe's schools are inspiring young people to excel in STEM at the "Learning EXPO" on Wednesday, April 6, from 5 to 7 p.m. in the Performing Arts Center at Monroe High School, 17001 Tester Road. No admission will be charged. More than 100 students from grades 4-8 will be on hand to share their learning.

In addition, the EXPO features high school students enrolled in several of Monroe High School's STEM courses with demonstrations in areas including robotics, animal sciences, computer-aid design, electric vehicles, and engineering used to design bridges.
