

Guideline for Cleaning and Sanitizing Toys

How to clean and sanitize

- 1. Clean with liquid soap (or dish detergent) and water to remove visible dirt and soil. Use paper towels or cloths which are washed daily. Avoid using sponges.
- 2. Rinse surfaces with water. Make sure there is no remaining soap residue.
- 3. Sanitize toys to get rid of germs.

Use 1/4 teaspoon unscented bleach per quart of cool water.

Use 1/8 teaspoon unscented bleach per 16 oz. spray bottle.

- 4. Allow the bleach solution to remain on surfaces for 2 minutes. Wipe dry with a clean paper towel or air dry.
- 5. Many toys can be cleaned and sanitized using a dishwasher with a "sani-cycle" or set to heat dry.
- 6. Stuffed toys can be washed in a hot washer and dried in a hot dryer.

How often

- 1. Toys must be cleaned and sanitized daily when handled/mouthed by students.
- 2. Toys placed in the mouth should be cleaned and sanitized after each use by different children.
- 3. Stuffed toys must be laundered once a week.

Caution!

- 1. Prepare bleach solution daily! Wear protective eyewear and gloves when handling bleach. Use a MSDS-labeled plastic spray container with the concentration of the bleach solution marked on the bottle.
- 2. Discard unused solution.
- 3. NEVER mix bleach with any other cleaners!
- 4. Keep bleach/solution in a locked cabinet, away from food and not accessible to students.
- 5. Avoid using bleach solution when students are in program. Use in a well ventilated area.
