3. Schedule and complete LILHS Entrance-Interview with the LILHS Principal in person, by phone, or on ZOOM.
4. Sign the LILHS Code of Commitment.
5. Submit all materials to LILHS. If more students apply than LILHS has space for, all eligible applications will be placed in the pool and a drawing will be conducted.
6. If accepted to LILHS, families must complete the district registration paperwork. Additionally, students will need to schedule a meeting with the counselor to build an individualized student learning plan prior to beginning courses.

- Complete a minimum of 27.5 hours per week of school work.
