


School Reopening Survey for Families Results

The survey was sent to all MSD families at our traditional schools on July 21, 2020 at 10:35 a.m. The survey is set to close Monday, July 27 at noon.


As of 11:30 a.m. on July 23, 2020, we received 2,471 responses. These responses represent roughly 40% of our current student enrollment at our traditional schools.

What is your preferred language? ¿Cuál es tu idioma preferido?



Which school is your child registered to attend this fall? (Please fill out one survey per currently enrolled student)




IF we are able to safely offer in-person instruction this fall, do you prefer to:





Students should be in school full-time. If online is part of schooling, a MUCH better job of teaching and actually having expectations for doing the work needs to happen. NOTHING was learned the last 3 months of last school year which is not a great way to prepare students for future grades and for life beyond high school
How do parents feel confident the district is able to meet learning need of special needs students that are learning remotely?
Will all students have to quarantine for 2 weeks if a student/ staff tests positive?

We prefer full remote learning going into this year. Regarding whether it is full time on campus, or a hybrid model we would still like to do full time remote. Considering what is going on with Covid-19 will full time remote still be an option for those families not wanting to do the other two, or would we have to look for other options for education?
This is ridiculous.
If we choose remote only model, would there be opportunities to still go in to the school for things such as labs and other tasks that require in-person interactions? My daughter is scheduled to take biotech and yearbook. She prefers online instruction but would also appreciate the opportunity to go in to the school to do labs and fulfill her role as the editor of the yearbook (which involves working with the other yearbook staff members). Is there a potential for something like this? Can special circumstances be accommodated so students can get the most from their school year? It is her senior year and she wants to make sure she is fully prepared to go on to college in a year.
Younger ones have a notoriously difficult time with zoom....I am concerned over the amount of required time if we have to go fully remote.

I am concerned because my daughter has an IEP if we go completely remote I am going to have to go outside our home to get her the support she receives in school

Will you be making sure that siblings across schools fall on the same schedule? Otherwise it will be a childcare nightmare. Are you at all looking at allowing grades 3-5 children of first responders and teachers to come to school all 4 days like k-2?
If the model with attending in person is used how will know its safe for our kids?
Plan for siblings?
I am a single full time working mom raising my kids on my own, and the hybrid learning model is almost impossible for me to be able to do. There's no way I can

rely on my sitter to homeschool part time, nor can I take time off from work to assist with the homeschool structure.

I don't think we can entertain even a hybrid model until we are in Phase 3 at least. I could support hybrid only for classes that are physical in nature and could very effectively socially distance such as drama, yoga, or potentially choir and band - but not classroom based classes. Not until there is secure progress in the county and a vaccine. I'd like to know how soon the final decisions will be made - this affects our actions to potentially unenroll our student, and online options such as K-12 also have capacity concerns.

How long will the school day be? Will students eat lunch/snacks? Will they wear masks in PE and/or Music?

How would the Montessori program work at Maltby Elementary?

My son has Sno Isle and it will be difficult for him to do that if we do complete online schooling

I have two children at Freylands where one is in 2nd grade and the other is in 3rd grade. Most concerned about my oldest child special needs and her ability to have a stable schedule.

How are the elective classes going to be held this year? For instance Culinary Arts or Band? Will students be allowed to still have these classes available for them?

I think if my child was to attend 2 days a week it would be very difficult for me to have them understand and do the other 3 online.

Concerned with both parents that need to be away working during the time a child is remote learning at home.

Would you be assigning days across all grade levels by last name so students in all schools have the same days and would days remain consistent from week to week?

Before I can be sure my answers are set in stone, I need to know if there is a safe air system installed at the high school. My answers may change depending on what sort of precautions are set in place and what sort of ventilation system is installed in the school. I also would not want my child in any sort of a portable classroom setting.

What makes you think you can keep our kids safe? I want a distance learning 5 days a week.

How long will 1st graders be asked to sit at their desks? If the plan is to have them at desks the entire day, is there an option for them to attend half days and complete some work at home the other half? I am concerned with sending my 6 year old to school and having them be sitting the entire day. Also, will the kids be doing all computer work at school to prevent passing papers etc, or will there be other ways for them to learn? I am also concerned with this possibility, my 6 year old has a very hard time with long stretches of computer work.

Thank you for all the hard work, I know this is very difficult to navigate.
How much parent involvement is expected during fully remote learning? Would the (elementary) fully remote learning model have a schedule that included breaks for lunch/recess time, or how would the day be broken up and what's the active learning time? Would fully remote learning still be run by the teacher at school, or would it be a separate program?

My child is in the Montessori program. Will families choosing to keep their child at home for health and safety negatively affect the program?

I will have a first grader . I was hoping maybe they would be able to do one day of In person instruction per week and 4 at home. I think 4 at school will worry me too much, but none, though safer, would not be great for social skills and learning.

Child has a very hard time and is incredibly uncomfortable keeping a mask on, that's my number one concern. I'd prefer no f2f learning if unrealistic and uncomfortable measures have to be followed. Also is hard for my child's mental health when there is no being near friends, no sharing supplies or toys, no outdoor recess, no music, no library, eating lunch at desks, no field trips.

Does Monroe school district have any idea what graduation / prom / senior activities will look like for the class of 2021? Last years senior class had a heartbreaking year and I'd hate to see my senior go through the same thing. They missed out on so much.

We weren't able to pick up a Chromebook for our daughter lastvyear and had to use a personal laptop. Can we get a Chromebook for our student for this school year?

What will occur if someone in the school has a confirmed case of COVID-19? What will PE, lunch, recess, etc. look like? How will a teacher enforce the mask rule for a group of 20+ children? Are more paraeducators being hired to assist with classroom management? What will IEPs/504s look like during the hybrid model?

I think some classes should be in class, such as math, some Science. Classes with difficult subject matter should be in class.

Most other classes are just reading, study, and testing. Such as language arts, social studies, history. These type classes are mostly memorizing and testing.

What about the kids that need extra help? My 3rd grader was in extra help and once it changed to remote learning, he declined. Remote does not work for larger families. If it turns to remote, we will be looking down different avenues on what works better for our family.

How about sending out info to help.your child such as tutors, not all parents feel good about educating our children as we get more frustrated.

My child has almost full time attendance in the SLC classroom. Online or remote learning is pointless. Please provide info on that model.

Before we go back to a classroom model we want to feel safe. We have my mother-in-law living with us, I myself am over 50 and the sole source of income for our family. With my wife being able to teach my son full time, remote worked out well for us. I get not all families are able to accommodate this, but as we can, we really need to feel like there is no risk in returning to the classroom.

It would be nice if students from the same family and neighborhood went to school on the same days.

We will unenroll if MSD is still trying to do the "social distancing" BS. It's all politics and I really wish that there was a way to get a credit on my property taxes that I have to pay for a school that isn't even open as it should be.

4 days a week is not enough. We are full time working. I have three children at two different schools and three different learning modes. This simply doesn't work! Why in the most important years for reading and learning the most critical content would 4 days be sufficient. Also what 4 days? Would it be the same as my 3rd grader and 11th grade? There is not enough info here

I need to know what backup plan is being prepared for grades K-2 if no viable safe distance option is found per the email received. There is no indication what other options besides fully remote. My son needs the social interaction aspect of school.

My child is desperate for in person instruction. She struggled mentally with not having interaction with her classmates and friends. My question is if there are going to be additional counselling to deal with the mental health of the kids. My child who is generally very happy and outgoing experienced depression and sadness frequently during remote learning. I also want to say that I know this situation is SO hard and I know the school district and volunteers are working very hard and I appreciate everything you all are doing.

Cleaning process, playground/physical activity options?, if school is not going to be open everyday is there going to be child care provided for those families who need to go work?

How involved are teachers going to be this year? 1st grade was terrible for my son when we went remote. Will teachers have to be involved a certain amount? Teachers need requirements as well. They can't just teach when it's convenient for them or write us emails complaining about their jobs. My sons education is important and i will not tolerate a terrible teacher guiding him through his most important years.

I don't feel like MSD is making the best decision for the safety of the community with in person classes.I refuse to use Zoom and be responsible for someone else' curriculum. however I would love a situation where I could keep the kids enrolled, but be on our home schedule and have monthly check-ins for progress and questions. Is this possible or even an entertained Idea?

I have three children all different learning modes and schedules. This simply doesn't work! Working parents cannot get their three children to school on different schedules and be avail so for another child who is home learning and work! This can not be the best options!!!
Something that isn't talked about is buses, recess, PE this all factors into what model or removal that we choose.

What does online learning look like? Can students adjust schedules for example dropping second language for a class more manageable to learn online? What type of cleaning will happen each night? If schools are able to open safely, I want my son to go. Not only is he missing the social aspect of school, but there is no way I, as a single parent, can replicate what a teacher does in school, while I work full time. Luckily, I have the ability to work from home, but it was difficult doing both. He will definitely attend school in any capacity that is available and safe.

REMOTE LEARNING DOES NOT WORK AT ALL

I'm curious to know if days will be shorter and my son will just attend core classes (to reduce passing times), also if he will be eating in his classroom, will he still get to see his friend group somehow? I'm pretty curious about all of it right now, but I understand you have a lot of tough decisions to make. I know that whatever plans you come up with will be in the best interests of students and staff given the unique circumstances.

I'm just hoping to get my kids back in school. My now second grader fell even farther behind due to online learning. He did not cope well with the online lessons. And my Kindergarten kiddo definitely needs the structure of in person learning so she can grasp the basics.

I do not plan on maintaining just online learning. I feel as though the children need an amount of social interaction. If there were other options available for them to interact with each other online may be fine but many of these children rely on feeling safe and accepted while on school property. This may be the only break from a bad environment they may have at home. The long term effects are severe.

How do you intend to address IEP students??

I don't have any questions yet. But I might have some when it gets closer. Thank you for your hard work keeping our kids safe. :)

How can you guarantee the students receive anywhere near the same level of education only going to school two days a week????

No questions, just comments. Mask wearing must be mandatory in school, and the remote learning portion must be more robust than the end of the last school year. Actual instruction time was too infrequent for a remote model. I think that we can still provide flexibility while making sure we provide instruction time that was equitable to the pre-COVID normal.

Full return to school was not on the list. That is what I want. Children are not learning adequately at home, even with active learning parents and the social skills needed are not being met. Kids are extremely low risk and need to be in school.

I am currently unsure of the ability for the district to provide in person safely. Perhaps more information on safety procedures and plans would make me feel more secure with the Hybrid model. Maybe this survey would have slightly different results after those plans are made. Thank you.

I'm concerned that if we choose to be fully remote during the beginning of the year that we won't be able to return to our assigned classroom if things improve some time during the year. I would love to know more about how fully remote Learning will transition to in class learning if/when things improve with the virus. We are not comfortable sending our kids back to school in person at this time but if they will not be able to transition back at all in class, we may opt for an outside homeschooling option vs remote learning with the school. Also, if we choose to have our child fully remote, will they still be working with a teacher from their assigned elementary? Will they be in "class" with other students they know? TIA!

Remote learning is an absolute disaster for my son with IEP and ADHD. Also he is enrolled in SnoIsle - i sure hope he can continue in the program. Begging :)

There should be a designated amount of face to face learning. These children have been conditioned from a young age to be accountable in person. To shut this off abruptly and expect a child to change a developmentally conditioned response is not logical.

In the case of the hybrid model, what will be the procedure for notification of families if a student, teacher, or family member of those becomes infected with covid-19 and has potentially been in contact with a child at the school? What will quarantine models look like in that event? What about testing for those possibly exposed?

If hybrid wins, will we have the option of 5 days remote for our individual children for health reasons? My daughter is a heart patient and cannot attend at all until a vaccine is available and used widely.

Will there be any 1 on 1 time with a teacher in the fully remote model?

My concern is hybrid or all remote will not fulfill my student's educational needs. He is an 8th grader this year and taking classes that count for high school as well as the foundation for future classes. I have not seen enough on how the remote learning will be improved from this past spring.

Would like clarification on the online curriculum and how it will be more robust than what was provided in the spring.

We should not consider in-person learning until there is a widely available vaccine and case numbers are going down.

I have a kindergartner and 3rd grader, would the 3rd grader be going to school for her 2 days on the same days as him?

IF enrollment and guidelines allow, I would be curious about k-2 being on a 2/3 or 3/2 hybrid schedule vs 4/1. I don't really feel comfortable with my kinder being on ground 4 days at this point.

I do not envy the choices and decisions that you (teachers and staff) are making - I absolutely understand that there is no one answer that everyone is going to be happy with, and I know you are all working very hard to build a schedule that will work for the majority of people.

What measures are being put in place to protect my children and staff outside of the guidelines that are already in place? What happens if an outbreak occurs in our schools because students are returning face to face-where will liability fall? Are supports being put in place for working parents and daycare? Can you assure that my children will not bring the virus home to my high risk family members? Can school opening be delayed until January and pushed through summer 2021 to make up days? How and when are you going to be able to answer these questions

and more? Will there be a community forum that includes all of the questions and answers from these surveys?

Additionally, it's harder to imagine my first grader being able to wear a mask all day, four days a week. 2. With a fully remote option, it would be nice if there was a "live" class going on. Basically, having a camera of sorts sitting in on the in-person class, that's viewable from children at home.

IMPORTANT: Our biggest issue with the spring remote learning was that even though we were all using the same platform (Canvas) each teacher and specialist used it significantly differently. There are so many different places to look for an assignment or link; that we'd be late to a Zoom meeting or miss an assignment because district personnel kept things the same. Sometimes it was in the calendar and sometimes it was in announcements, or my email, or my kids' school email, or in the weekly schedule..... so many places to look for one assignment for one kid. It felt like that every day that we logged in and I have two kids both with additional specialists. It was like trying to find Waldo on a website. It was challenging for a computer-savvy adult to find assignments each day, let alone trying to have two elementary kids trying to do anything on their own!! We need something that is streamlined for the kids to be able to navigate completely on their own because then each day they know exactly where to look and what to do. (It allows me to help them with the actual lesson as opposed to playing hide and seek with assignments) When using the program differently every day they aren't able to help themselves while I'm trying to help the other find an assignment or link. It gets super challenging trying to teach two kids two completely different lessons at the same time but for the majority of that learning time I'm personally going in and out of every place I can think of to find a simple assignment or note left by an instructor because nobody uses Canvas the same way at all!! Please streamline the platform so all teachers are using it the same way. **SIMPLIFIED** and easy for **CHILDREN** to locate, complete and turn in their assignments. You will have much less complaining from the community!!

No questions. My hope is that the teachers and students will not be sacrificed so that "things can return to normal" or so that people can have free childcare- which is how education is ultimately viewed. I hope that science and data will be used to determine the opening of schools and that schools will **NOT** open for in-person instruction until there are at least 14+ days without a new COVID case in the county.

My question is has childcare been brought up? You have a lot of MSD staff with children in school and how are they expected to teach 5 days a week but only have their children at school 2 to 4 days a week? Specially for those staff members who may have had their hours cut so now they are contemplating quitting because they can't afford to work and pay for childcare?

I don't really feel comfortable sending my kids to school while people in town are still walking around either without a mask or wearing it under their nose. That being said I'm concerned about the isolation effect on my child who attends Fryelands. Would it be possible for parents to have a zoom directory so that parents can make sure their kids are getting socially distant zoom hang outs for kids? In the before times, we could sign up to have our names added to a parents directory for party invites etc. I don't really want my kids hanging out with a bunch of other kids, but I want them to still enjoy the social aspects (virtual hang outs) as much as possible. Thank you all, so much, for everything you are doing!!! These are certainly crazy days! I hope you get more uplifting messages in return than frustrated and angry comments!

Will this be consistent across the board for every school (lessons, etc)...because each class was not consistent. Also, what will happen when schools have to shut down? What will the reopening guidelines be? How will the transition happen?

1)Importance of certificate earning classes still being accredited even with the reduce hands on experience. Ex: Core plus manufacturing tech.

2) Its probably too late to suggest to garner any actual consideration, but here goes... what about a hybrid situation divided by inherent nature of the CLASS? Where classes that demand in person functioning like lab science, manufacturing tech, ceramics, etc are the classes held in person, but classes like literature, history, government, world religion, even math are done via remote learning (more frequent meeting than ZOOM once a week btw).

I have several kids, I need them to go to school on the same days or it is unsafe for them. Would the a and b days be the same for the all the kids in one household?

Most office workers are not looking to return until 2021, I am extremely concerned for possible in person learning models for our kids for the fall. I would like to see better curriculum and communication with parents for a fully remote or even partially remote option. When I asked my son's teacher this spring if they had a parent zoom meeting to keep us up to date in what we needed to do the response was, hmm ..a zoom for parents, that's interesting. I asked because we first had a schedule, then the schedule stopped being updated, I asked about this and was told there was a once a week meeting, after a few weeks I got an email saying my son didn't turn in work, no communication was given anywhere what work was or what expectations were. For future remote learning, please be clear on schedules, expectations, etc we felt completely lost trying to support our kids and their schoolwork.

I have a child with autism and can't get him to wear a mask. I'm a single mom and need to know how the school is going to do the mask with a child like this? He also doesn't understand the 6 feet apart. He gets in everyone's space. He will be starting kindergarten there this year.

My kids have fallen behind academically and now I'm afraid they're going to fall further behind.

My child is on an IEP. I believe 2 days a week is not enough to give him the tools needed to succeed. What is specifically being done to address IEP needs when remote learning is not a viable option?

My son is in grade 2 so it may not apply. My concern with distance learning with live videos is that both my husband and I work. My son goes to work with his dad daily as of now, and wouldn't have the ability to have a parent or adult helping him access the live videos, or keeping him on task during school hours. After work either myself or my husband can sit down and do the days worth of work in a few hours (hopefully). Is this something that has been considered already?

We did not have a good experience with our kinder teacher last year, we had 3 zoom calls and she was almost impossible to get a hold of at fryelands. Other K teachers were super interactive with their class, even worked with kids 6 feet apart at their homes to try and teach. Will the curriculum and teacher expectations be the same? What about food allergies and classroom learning/lunch eating in the classroom? K-2 kids are young and don't always want to wear a mask, how will this be enforced? Recess, how will they work? K-2 seem to want to touch everything. Class size, how many kids per class?

This would be my child's first year in high school, so it's hard to know what to expect from the workload etc. I hope there is a lot of support for kids who tend to struggle with school in general. I do understand this is new for all of us, and that in the past kids have gown without schooling for various reasons and have done just fine. I don't feel comfortable sending my kids to school while people here in town are still walking around either without masks or wearing them improperly. There is a shocking lack of caring for the community and our neighbors that is rather disheartening, and considering a lot of kids come from homes of these people I'm not sure it's so safe for the kids to go back to school even on a limited basis. I hope you all know that I appreciate all the hard work you all are putting into this, and I certainly hope you don't get too many idiots complaining about things beyond your control. There are lots of us who really do understand and thank you for all your hard work and support!!

No questions

This learning model does not address special needs children at all. My son is in the SLC classroom and I am at a loss for what to do. Remote learning is impossible for him, his IEP was completely thrown away in the spring and although I am patient in the light of something unforeseen like a global pandemic, I am loosing patience at this point of having no answers of what our options in the fall are. Are you not aware that special needs families can not just make huge childcare decisions in the span of days or weeks? We can't just leave our children with people unqualified to help them. Private therapies are helpful but they need to know ASAP what our schedule is like and how much support we need. My son was already pulled out of ESY because he can't wear a mask. What are we supposed to do if his disability prevents him from wearing PPE and also prevents him from getting any benefit from remote learning? At no point in your email about considerations for the hybrid vs full remote models do you even MENTION special ed children. Why are we

forgotten? Our children...the most vulnerable....the ones who are regressing and suffering the most are not even acknowledged in your email about these huge important discussions. I'm so heartbroken that my son is suffering so much and there are no good answers but to not even be mentioned as a part of this decision making is hurtful. Do better.

What about families with kids that attend different schools? Will they have the same schedule?

Will days be based on on last name so that siblings attend the same days? My son will be 3rd but my daughter K.

I have 3 kids in MSD. They will be going into 10th grade, 4th grade and 1st grade. I prefer the hybrid model, however I would need my HS students schedule to coincide with my 4th grader to allow me to work as a 1:1 paraeducator in the MSD with a 2nd grader. The 2nd grader would be on a complete opposite schedule and I can't leave my 4th grader at home alone on the days I would be required to physically be at school for my job. I have a feeling there is a ton of families with multiple kids who will need to have some say in their kids "A day, or B day" so that siblings can care for one another if parents have to work. Just wanted to know if that was an option to adjust schedules if it came to it. Thank you!!

Will remote learning be a half day or full day 5 days a week? I like 5 days a week; my son didn't seem to have much in actual instruction (2 days) when online in the Spring.

My child doesn't do well with remote learning. She really needs to be able to ask questions and receive IN PERSON teaching. I truly feel my daughter will languish and fall between the cracks If forced to do total remote. If that happens I will be forced to find a tutor to teach my daughter. im not sure How I will find the funds to do that but that's the only way my daughter learns

Very disappointed in School District to no longer offer in class schooling 5 days a week. This is utterly ridiculous that families are having to juggle day care issues, still pay an exorbitant amount in taxes and the schools not providing five days a week in the classroom for a virus that has a less percentage rate of the flu.

My child is going into developmental prek. Not a part of this conversation apparently. Are the special education children a part of this conversation, because I don't see that being mentioned at all? I really expect more acknowledgment of those who have IEPs and 504s when you send out these emails and surveys. To not even mention it is just a reflection of what we as parents are feeling; dread that our children will be forgotten during this situation...that they will suffer without access to education because they can't fit into these boxes that typical developing children can.

We have a young child that is high risk for complications if exposed to covid-19. We are electing to keep our kids home this year for remote learning. We appreciate the district offering remote learning to protect our family. Both of our kids have IEPs and require more one on one learning. Our zoom lessons in the spring were excellent and really helped our kids feel like learning at home was just as important as learning at school. Seeing their teachers virtually helped them to be accountable and to continue their desire to keep trying. We believe that helped our kids tremendously!

Canvas is an excellent platform and has so much potential! However, we strongly believe that if all district personnel were using the platform the same, it would be easier and less stressful/frustrating for the kids. When everyone uses it differently and puts notes or assignments in different locations, kids get frustrated and upset. They want to do the work, they want to do well but they change their minds when it takes so long to locate!! I don't blame them, adults feel the exact same way when we can't find something! If the teachers want an assignment to be completed, they need to place it in the same area each time so a parent or child can EASILY locate it without having to look in every single possible place it could be!! Please, STREAMLINE how ALL the of teachers, specialists and School personnel send messages, assign work and use the calendar. Create simplicity for our district families and cohesiveness with the district personnel!! (This concept will bring a better response from the community and better learning for our children!!)

My son had so many missing assignments. When he finally caught up a did the work there was no change in his overall grade, all that work and it didn't even reflect.

Will we have a more structured learning model for the in-home learning days? The end of the school year seemed very unorganized and my child didn't really gain anything from the in-home learning last year.

Most parents would prefer 3 days in school and 2 days at home if possible.

How will the school keep students 6 feet apart? How will the school keep teachers safe? What will happen with a class if a teacher or student gets sick?

9th graders are new to the high school. There needs to be a back to school sfor the remote only kids to meet the teachers and see the school. This could be something where you send out an orientation video and take a camera around the school and do a zoom or, have the kids sign up for 10 min slots To tour and, a social distance meet and greet on the field. The remote kids also need the opportunity to participate in clubs and extracurriculars virtual. A fourth option was not listed where people go to Monroe for some classes and go Washington connections academy for some classes.

at the high school level, will they continue with 8 periods /week or is there talk to switch to 4 classes/week / per quarter / semester so students can focus more time with each class since they will only be meeting in person 2 days/week. With this schedule, they could finish a semester class in 1 quarter and a year long class in one semester. With this model, it would be possible to meet with all 4 periods on both days of in person instruction instead on just one day/week with the 8 period schedule.
It would be great to use same platform as the other classes. Maltby 1st graders curriculum last year was difficult to maneuver since we seemed to be using a different setup than everyone else.

Will teachers increase their video teaching time? Instruction needs to be a recorded video so we can view when needed. Will parents get to choose teaching time? Zoom meetings at lunch time and late afternoon are not acceptable!
Prefer full week in person
Would really prefer my kids to attend 3 days instead of 2.
How will you handle in person classes if someone is diagnosed?
What about families with kids that attend different schools? Will they have the same schedule?
How are students with IEP's supported? Extra access for help? After school sports? Other extracurricular activities? Accommodations for students who need continuous structure?
At the start of the school year it would be nice to have in person instruction for the teachers and students to meet and get to know each other. THEN it would be nice to transition to an all remote model. Thank you.
Phase 4 is for large groups. Schools should not be in person until this threshold is met.
Please do not rush this decision. These are our children, teachers and families at risk.
Will it be for the whole year? What will recess look like? Will there be PE, music and library?
How will remote learning serve the special needs population?

How will sports and science labs be offered?

I am concerned with remote learning and the ability to provide adequate instruction for the students. During the Spring of 2020 we saw a wide range of teacher engagement that simply didn't hit the mark. What improvements will the MSD make to ensure our students are getting the proper instruction to progress in their learning journey? I understand the Snohomish School District will provide APEX online learning. Is MSD considering a comparative approach?

I picked the remote learning because my student is going to do running start with only 1 class at the high school (PE). So it would be really easy to not count my student in numbers when planning how many would return. She would be fine with going to school too. The survey just did not have a running start option.

My concerns about returning too soon to in-person classrooms would jeopardize the health and safety of generations of family units.

Will there be any flexibility in which group A or B that a student is placed in the case of extended family and childcare...for example, can my student be in the same group as her cousins so her aunt can provide childcare on the online days? Will there be a process for this in place so that the classes can still stay balanced and small?

Would all of the class periods meet each day that there is in person instruction? Or would it be more of the AB schedule where half the periods meet one and day and the other half the next? (In other words, would each individual class have in person instruction 1 or 2 times per week?)

How will sports and science labs be enabled if all remote?

How will teachers be held accountable for their work days? Remote learning last time had teachers admitting during their "touch base" calls to families that ". Well, I am done for the day - I am going fishing with my husband"- if I am going to teach my kids at home I want to know that teachers are doing the professional job we supported their professional salary for. Both myself and my husband work full time, I work out of a home office- how will teacher communication work (the last time I heard from my 4th graders teacher was April 15) What will happen with special education- how will those students get PT and other services through a remote model? How are teachers improving their online teaching skills- I appreciate that this was out of their element when this first happened(it would be like someone asking me to do my job under water for example- so I understand that) but they have had months now of to continue their own education around providing a better model. Have you partnered with private companies to figure out how to do this better? How specifically has the district been improving on what was "continuous learning" since last March. I do not support the learning that was done and if we return to the same quality as what we had in March, I will remove my kids from the school district. I don't want to see teachers during their work day at the grocery store, Lake Tye, I don't want to see social media posts of them and what they are doing during school hours.

It is insulting to those of us at home, doing our jobs while doing a portion of theirs as well. I am specifically concerned about high school age kids- having them return to 8 periods, where they are exposed to 15 different kids in class - who have all

been exposed to 15 kids in their other 8 classes may as well expose them to the whole school. Why risk the exposure for just 2 days a week?

How will the hybrid model be able to function if teachers are in person 4 days/week (2 and 2). Who will be providing online content and be available for questions during the 3 days of distance learning?

What is being done for IEP students? The general education teachers seem to defer to the IEP teachers and not bother making an effort at all.

Truthfully unless there is full time in-person learning we are enrolling our child in accredited online school.

Is it possible to alter the classes for HS. 8 classes during distance learning is too much and not manageable for some students. If function on an A/B schedule to reduce the number of students in the building, who will be responsible for the distance learning portion as the teachers will be with students. Who will be available to answer question or provide help on their distance learning days?

I am concerned that the online model is not enough as my child barely learned anything with only an hour of online schooling a day. I do not feel it is adequate enough learning and am very concerned that my child will be falling behind. I feel there needs to be more learning done with the teachers online either one on one or in a normal classroom type setting online. To go from 5 hours a day learning at school to 1 seems highly insufficient, especially as my child is getting older and the the school work is becoming more challenging.

Will kids from the same families be on the same schedules?

Will in person specialist classes (P.E., music, library, digital learning) still be offered with the hybrid model?

Will there be music, PE, Library?

I have 3 kids in school. 1 at Elementary, Middle School, and High School each. In hybrid how do you plan to accommodate possible conflicting schedules for each? For remote learning the non standardized curriculum, lack of consistent schedule, and guided learning (online classes with instructors more frequently and on a consistent basis), and unclear deliverables was very challenging. It is going to be important to address all those if remote in Fall. That is strongly preferred as based on data and trend across the US right now do not feel we will be in a safe place by September to return to even a hybrid model.

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Let the kids go back to school. People will lose jobs over this.

Why isn't full school an option and I have more than one kid in this school district and I find it funny the one that goes to none of these schools is likely to do school as normal your already risking child so why not go all time so many students are not doing online learning because they know they can't fail so they just quite doing it at all and learned nothing falling through the cracks and falling behind they don't even take attendance this way it's bullshit.

I would really like full in person schedule, I am at disadvantage because I work outside the house and don't have time for home schooling. With so many people continuing working through the pandemic I don't understand why the schools need be protected or why should they be considered more vulnerable than others people. The last 4 months of the school year, the remote learning was a joke, I feel that my child's education will be compromised just to fulfill the teachers fear of coronavirus

Would students in grades 3-5 on IEPs possibly be able to get more in person instruction?

It's impossible for me to teach my child while also working full time.

My biggest concern is safety of kids and teachers. I don't want to be back in until numbers of virus are down. Thanks for all the hard and difficult work you are doing-there is no blueprint for this and you all are doing an awesome job. Thank you!

We'll probably need to do remote learning because two of our household members are high risk (including our student). I would like the amount of time of computer instruction to be as low as possible because it's more tiring to sit for long periods at a time looking at a screen.

One concern I have is that my student might fall behind if she is at home compared to students at school if the material is different. She seemed to do fine with the remote learning in the spring though.

How can we trust the staff when you are complicit in fearmongering our children?

How can I help best transition my brand new middle schooler and high schooler to a new school AND a new learning model?

Will there be an easier program for kids to navigate than what we had previously.

I don't agree with any of it. I realize these are the options. Our kids should be in school full time but since it's not we will do online running start.

Let's get the kids back in person full time!!!!

If you offer a hybrid model or the fully online model, will the high school still have the students register for 8 classes? The amount of executive function that was necessary to manage that was more than my student can take, even with my consistent help. I am not sure that teachers can manage that much with either option. Frankly, the 8 class schedule will play a huge role in our decision whether to keep our son enrolled in MHS or move to a different school or model. He's also applying for Running Start as he will be a junior next year.

More in person instruction, students need 1 on 1 instruction on how to use canvas, Google docs and email.

When will the district consider full time face to face learning?

Please teach the children on how to use the digital learning tools.

Is sports happening?

If a vaccine is found to help with relief from the virus, will it be required for my child to attend? What if the child develops immunity through natural ways? How can I help my child when I work full time and do not have the ability to help her to learn? I am already low on time as a single mother. I care about others health and safety, but it also puts my child at a disadvantage.

I think it would be good for MSD to formally consider the option of students/families using alternate methods of online learning, like K12. I realize you had a selection for "leaving MSD....". I didn't select that because our choice is Hybrid as we personally want to stay in MSD. However, it would be good to know our options. MSD could communicate how the scenario would work if a child does move to alternate online learning temporarily and decides to come back to MSD at a later date. It's not the teachers we are concerned about. Both our sons have had wonderful experiences with the teachers in MSD. However, the MSD teachers are skilled at in-person teaching, not online teaching. We are concerned about the quality of education our sons will receive learning online from teachers who have not been trained/educated on how to perform successful online learning.

How will the district implement a fully remote learning method without the proper hardware, such as web cameras, high speed internet access, etc in place?

Who will be instructing the online option since currently employed certified teachers will be utilized in classrooms?

Is the HS considering departing from the newly minted 8 period schedule in order to better accommodate student learning in core areas given that contact and instruction time will be severely impacted by either planned model?

What precautions such as proper PPE will the district provide to its staff and students to help ensure appropriate usage?

More communication about assignments to parents, clear instruction to students on digital learning days. Options for additional in person instruction.

I have a 1st grader, is there a chance it will be half days? As I won't want her in school 4 days a week 6 hours a day with a mask on and no recess. If it's full time we will do full remote learning

Will Friday's be early release?

I would prefer NOT to be early since our in classroom time will be limited.

Last portion of the school year that just ended the students were graded on a pass or fail but no real constructive grading or feedback was provided. Moving into the Fall will there be more utilization of one on one time with the teacher either online or in person that will see a more concise grading scale and constructive feedback to work on each week?

I think it would be good for MSD to formally consider the option of students/families using alternate methods of online learning, like K12. I realize you had a selection for "leaving MSD....". I didn't select that because our choice is Hybrid as we personally want to stay in MSD. However, it would be good to know our options. MSD could communicate how the scenario would work if a child does move to alternate online learning temporarily and decides to come back to MSD at a later date. Its not the teachers we are concerned about. Both our sons have had wonderful experiences with the teachers in MSD. However, the MSD teachers are skilled at in-person teaching, not online teaching. We are concerned about the quality of education our sons will receive learning online from teachers who have not been trained/educated on how to perform successful online learning.

Will school hours change or be same?

Will school lunch be available in both, in school and at home learning days?

Will switching between both hybrid and full school be allowed voluntarily?

Will students/parents be signing waivers to protect schools & teachers?

Is this the whole year or re evaluate in Jan?

One question I have is, has MSD considered desk shields? My husband has a portable acrylic/plexiglass shield on his work desk that is creating a barrier between his workmates, the cost is minimal to make these and seem like they would provide the necessary protection for students and staff.

I'm 100% in favor of having the k-2 attend in person, 4 days a week. These students truly need the foundation of skills accessible in the classroom environment. The risk to this age group has been proven to be extremely low, and obviously, if a family felt concerned, they could opt out for 100% remote learning. I understand staff have a higher risk (being adults), but with the potential desk barriers (suggested above), masks/face shields, and frequent hand washing, their risk should be decreased significantly.

I'm not interested in 100% remote learning for my k-2 student. It was a disaster, with crying from my student every single day we attempted to "distance learn" . I will need to pull her from MSD and find an alternative option if 100% remote learning is the decision moving forward for k-2. Thank you for your time and consideration of my question and comment.

Are there options on the table for kids in person learning everyday?

I really want the kids in class but am concerned if it can be done safely and want to make sure masks and distancing is strictly enforced and temperatures are checked before they get on bus or get to school there are a lot of Monroe families not taking this seriously and not masking or social distancing in their homes

Siblings should all attend on the same day regardless of age.

We would prefer all our children attending school on the same days (we have students at elementary, middle and high school).

Siblings should ride the same bus on the same day at the same time.

You spoke to an "enhanced" version of online learning than what we saw in Spring of 2020. What resources are you using to enhance that experience? I would love to keep my children home during these times, but the distance learning this spring left so much to be desired. If the only way to get my child a quality education is to send them in-person (which I doubt considering the safety measures we will all need to take) then where/how can I count on my kids to get the good education that they deserve and that my tax dollars are paying for?

I would like learning to be all remote until a vaccine is available.

I have a child entering kindergarten and one going into 3rd. Is there a way to ensure that if you have multiple children in a school that they are on the same schedule? Thank you.

I would like the high schoolers to go with their entire grade. Example 9th/11th and then 10th/12th

I would be in favor of an in person model as long as it can be done safely.

I believe each classroom would need:

- No more then 10 to 12 people per class.
- A hand washing station with scheduled hand washing every two hours.
- Hand sanitizer at each desk with scheduled usages throughout the day.
- Face masks for every child
- Desks 6 feet apart
- Individual supplies for each child (no sharing)

My coming 1st grader would rather be in school with in person learning but he is not going to wear a mask. He hates them, he wont be able to concentrate on learning if he is in a boxed seat and not allowed to leave his desk. If school was going to go back to a more normal setting (even split days/schedules without masks and isolation) he would be there. I am just concerned about the foundational pieces of education in elementary school. Also, my daughter seems to have issues pronouncing certain letters and words. I was told I couldn't evaluate her until she gets in school. So, will that still be able to happen if she does fully remote learning? Also, my daughter doesn't have a computer. How will that work? Will the schools supple the little ones with that?
Will band still be an in person class?
I would prefer they just got back to normal 5 day a week school. We feel that the poor quality of instruction coming from online school will hold our kids back. We want them to be back in school full time.
I think that hybrid would only work if the community numbers were low - otherwise online is a better option, kids will have trouble with masks - its probably less damaging to have online but at the lower grade levels it is extremely difficult - I think a work at your own pace program would be better, have packets distributed and then just work on them as we can and have time to enrich kids with other opportunities. The online 1st grade was an absolute nightmare.
If there is a positive covid case at our school what is the protocol?
We want our high school kid back in school full time, 5 days a week, in person. Being out of school limits opportunities that he really enjoys and helped push his academics to new heights this past year. Taking that away will have a negative affect on his learning.
I am worried about how this pandemic will effect my children's education.

For HS if it's hybrid I would like to see back to back days where teachers give and help with assignments and then work at home days, the zoom meetings, long online assignments and hundreds of emails for each student were an absolute nightmare for parents....just make a packet for the student and let them come in and get help.

I need more details on the differences between the plans first.

If I notice that my child is not learning properly via online, will he then have the option of doing some class schooling? that is if both options are available

Please! Make students accountable to a daily schedule, five days per week.

If hybrid model is implemented, will there be a possibility of the district changing mid year or during the school year to fully remote based on Covid status? Will there be Covid testing/vaccination requirements for students?

Why risk our children's lives by bringing them into school part time?

Will they hire more staff for supervision

How do you plan to insure sanitary conditions at the schools? I truly don't believe it is possible. Kids will get sick (like always) and spread it to others. Those kids and staff will take it home and spread it to their families. We will all be in quarantine in no time. I feel it is to dangerous at this time.

I am concerned about the risk to my child's life by a part time in-person program

How long will virtual lessons be? We have rather low bandwidth internet and it is not practical to be viewing hours of videos each day. How will families be made aware if there are positive COVID cases at the school? Will classes be susnded, or go virtual while the school is cleaned? How will attendance/absentees be accounted for if students need to quarantine?

I have a comment - having the same students back to back days makes more sense. It gives a day in between for surfaces to be sterilized, and for any surface contamination to subside on items that do not get sterilized regularly. Though surface transmission is not the vector in a majority of cases, it makes sense to be as conscientious as possible about a virus that can survive for some time on a variety of surfaces.

How many students will be in person together? Will there be an option to switch from 100% remote to in person if the health situation changes? What are the guidelines on hygiene and distancing that are being planned for? If I choose to unenroll for another online school, can I return to Monroe during the year? Will teachers be using Canvas the same? We had a big mix of how it was used in the spring. Will skyward be used for monitoring assignments and grades, or just canvas?

Can you change once the year starts if what you pick isn't working for you or your child?

How does this affect the Highly Capable group that has to be transported to Salem Woods if it's not their home school? How are teachers supposed to do online teaching when they are in the classroom 4 days per week due to A/B model? Who will be doing the online teaching? How will childcare be addressed for working parents, the 3 days young children are home, not old enough to stay home alone? How can you guarantee children won't be "left behind" if struggling due to lack of in-person education?

My son is in Spec Ed and has IEP, but we still prefer to keep him home for remote learning.

My middle schooler needs to be on the same schedule as my 4th grader.

Kids in same families need to be on the same schedule.

The more in-person learning the better, not a fan of the distance learning at all but understand you need to follow guidelines. My question is about my child's IEP. He got just about no help other than an email a week suggesting things he can do at home. He learned nothing after school closed. He NEEDS one on one help.

What supports / differentiated learning can be provided to gifted students? Can this be an opportunity to provide more customized options for our elementary students so the ones who need focused help can get it and others can be challenged at their level?

Can we stay enrolled in the district somehow and provide our own curriculum - like homeschool with training wheels? Is there a way we could get support thru the school district to ensure we are meeting state standards, but not deal with the 2.0 remote learning? I truly appreciate the efforts that teachers and staff went through to give the kids something to learn, but it did not work for our family and was painfully boring for my kid. It was confusing to know when assignments were due or if there were even assignments and zoom meetings were really challenging for my kid.

It's because the district has not explained what the difference between 1.0 and 2.0 distance learning is it makes it really easy to choose home school for us. If I had a better idea of what to expect, how it's been improved and enhanced and some idea of what it would look like I might consider 100% distant learning (we have an at-risk family member living with us that I don't want to put at additional risk by doing the hybrid model)

Have you considered the need for contact tracing and notification if someone is diagnosed with COVID - from bus (getting to school method) to potential contact with other classes then after school care at XYZ - so if a 5th grader with COVID is on the bus with a 1st and 3rd grader now those students and their classmates have possibly been exposed then they go to XYZ after school and expose those kids from 2 other elementary schools. Online learning was a debacle. We will find a virtual academy that knows what they are doing. We would stay if students were back in school full time.

We would love some guidance pertaining to band classes and how they could take place safely since students can't play instruments with masks on. Thank you.

I really hope you offer a full time in school option. That's what my kid and most kids need.

What form of online learning will be utilized? What was used this spring was not acceptable long term.

I currently have 4 kids in my house, 3 of my own and my niece. All 4 will attend Chain Lake Elementary. All adults in our home work full-time and critical for all of our mental health to have our children go to school, even if we must work with a hybrid model. Understand many families are in the situation and this is a huge burden. Will children still have the opportunity to learn music, play outside, join clubs?

My child got accepted into the highly capable program this coming school year, what is the plan for those kids? How will the curriculum look? For either hybrid or the online model?

What form of online learning will be utilized? Just using zoom is not an option.... How classes that inherently need hands on learning work?

A outlined curriculum so that my older student has a layout of due dates for projects/work so that we are all more up to date.

What is your plan for the face to face model? What happens if a teacher or student is exposed? Do they have to quarantine for 14 days? What happens if a teacher is out with it and there aren't any substitutes to teach the students?

If the kids are forced to wear a mask all day, we are out. If the kids cannot hug their friends, hold hands, talk closely, we are out. If the teachers have to wear masks all day, we are out. These children do not deserve to go to prison school.

What will this look like for special education preschool kids? Especially the ones needing social interaction.

I would really like full in person schedule, I am at disadvantage because I work outside the house and don't have time for home schooling. With so many people continuing working through the pandemic I don't understand why the schools need to be protected or why should they be considered more vulnerable than other people. The last 4 months of the school year, the remote learning was a joke, I feel that my child's education will be compromised just to fulfill the teachers fear of coronavirus

My questions are on the safety precautions - how will students remain socially distanced? What will be done to protect teachers/staff/admin? What considerations are there for allowing more outdoor learning? Are facilities being reviewed to see about always maintaining fresh circulation of air?

Also, what will the impact look like when a kid or teacher tests positive for COVID? Will the whole class move back to remote learning for some time?

Has there been any consideration at all for more of a nano-approach to elementary school? Like, group a few families together with a teacher, and go for a 1-room schoolhouse type of learning environment, where the teacher & families can navigate risk and safety at a level that just can't happen district-wide?

I honestly don't believe we CAN safely do hybrid learning at this point, not until we have greater, faster, testing capabilities, AND community infection rates drop substantially. So, while I answered Yes to the hypothetical "If we can do it safely," I don't believe that's a true possibility now, and suspect it will only be worse by Labor Day.

I hope to see more thought/effort/resources put in to what will be necessary to make remote learning a true successful way to educate our children, rather than just a placeholder/necessary evil/thing to be tolerated. This includes making sure teachers have the time/support to make their own curriculum online, or provide a good one to them; and making sure teachers have not just *access* to internet, but *high bandwidth* connections (it's impossible to have a quality Zoom meeting where the teacher freezes for 1 out of every 5 minutes.)

Lastly, obviously whatever the district puts in place, no family is going to be able to do a good job at home without support. Some families (mine included) can afford to find help (tutor/babysitter) but how can the district work with regional partners to help those who are unable to supplement? Just knowing the district has those lines of conversation open would be useful to parents.

For my students in SPED, both options are horrible for them. They desperately need the help and socialization. We have seen a dramatic regression. Last school year, our students would not follow through on work. They are losing so much in educational time.

SPED & children in PBS are not supported in this decision. Children with SPED or special needs, need consistency. They have regressed in their learning at pivotal times in their education. We are doing a huge disservice to this group of students. Please reconsider class of students for daily attendance. They need this structure to manage themselves and their behaviors.

How will teachers encourage a positive learning environment?

For my 1st grader, if he were to be in school 4 days a week, will there be an attempt to keep his cohort small, to limit exposure? I'd much rather he see the same 4 kids at school for less time, than a larger group for longer.

We're in the Montessori program; I haven't heard any specific proposals for that subgroup; I'm pretty sure the math doesn't work for having K-2 be in school for 4 days, with grades 3-5 doing 2 days each, as 1 of the three Montessori teachers has grades 1-3. Would an additional teacher be brought in for the extra in-class needs?

How is the district working to support remote learning for the Montessori program, or is the expectation that those students will just take advantage of whatever online resources (thinking, good curriculum with an online-first component) the districts provides? I'd like to propose working with the Montessori team to make sure they're getting the online resources they feel appropriate for their pedagogical methods. If there is going to be an in-school component for Montessori program, there will also need to be an investment made in more hands-on learning materials, so kids aren't forced to share materials before they've been appropriately cleaned.

Lastly, for the littlest ones, how is the district supporting teachers for getting PPE appropriate to not scare the Kinders? I'm not sure my son would have let go of my leg if I were to have dropped him off with a stranger wearing a face shield and surgical mask. But at the same time, these teachers are the ones who are going to have the hardest time remaining distant from their students. Is someone tasked with investigating and implementing options here?

Will you share the plans you have so far for a much more robust, enhanced remote learning experience that is aligned to state learning standards? It is worrisome that no real plans have been shared for how remote learning will look different than it did in the spring, which was less than adequate. If we are not confident in the district's plan to support our child's academic growth in the very near future, we will be pursuing other online schooling options, such as WAVA.

How are you planning to support students remotely who need academic support, such as LAP services? What will the guidance team referral process look like if we can't meet in person?

Will teachers be provided with additional training and support to guide and support an online learning model? Last year the opportunities and expectations regarding use of the learning platforms (Google, Canvas) were unclear/confusing, and much of the functionality was unused. Teacher had good intentions but lacked the hardware and technical skills to effectively drive learning. She also seemed unclear about how to use the tools or what might be best methodologies to engage students and support accountability from them.

How will students who are transitioning to a new school setting (kindergarten, 6th grade, 9th grade) be supported? Will there be orientations, even if they are virtual? How is the district planning to set these students up for success during these very important transitional years?

It is my opinion that with larger districts like Bellevue, Renton, and Kent among others who have officially announced full online for all students at least through the fall semester, it is irresponsible and unsafe to begin even a Hybrid model at this time. This feels more like it is being driven politically rather than by the actual situation. I love this district and this town. My student wants to get back to school with her friends and teachers, but she feels as I do that safety first is what is required here. My student will be participating in online only in the fall through MSD or I will remove her from the district. Even a Hybrid model at this point is dangerous considering how much controversy even a simple mask mandate has had in our community. (Still not being followed by all, by the way). Cases are still rising and we still have anti-mask sentiment in our community as well as Covid deniers. We cannot trust that parents will do the right thing and require their own kids to wear masks. Teachers shouldn't be forced to enforce either, but masks and social distance are absolutely needed. No options there.

While I feel this survey should have been sent out closer to the end of the last school session, Im glad you are finally asking for the opinion of ALL the district parents.

Having five kids in the school district and having you tell me that they light not go to school at all and learn from home is a joke. And having younger kids go 5 days a week makes no since, younger kids don't know anything about cleaning them selfs, washing hands exc. 4 out of the five kids I have have IEP and need assistants with reading and weighting. So what are you going todo about that?????? What are you going todo about child care since me and my wife both work to make a living for our family? Please tell me. If me or my wife has to quit our jobs will we now get paid to be a teacher? What you have proposed is a joke. At this point I think we are better off leaving the school district. To not even mention it is just a reflection of what we as parents are feeling; dread that our children will be forgotten during this situation...that they will suffer without access to education because they can't fit into these boxes that typical developing children can.
