Information about financial aid:

There are <u>two</u> options to apply for federal or state financial aid. Both applications open on <u>October 1st.</u> It is important to file early as some resources are limited and on a first-come, first-served basis. Be sure to check the application deadlines for each college you are considering.

To receive federal or state financial aid, you need to file <u>one</u> of the following applications:

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) if you are a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.

OR

<u>WASFA</u> (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) if you are ineligible to complete the FAFSA due to immigration status and meet the criteria for one of the <u>state aid programs</u> that provide aid to non-citizens.

College Bound Scholarship application and eligibility: The College Bound Scholarship program is an early commitment of state financial aid to eligible students who **sign up in middle school** and fulfill the scholarship pledge. For more information, click on <u>Eligibility to Apply: Sign Up</u>.
